Since 2006, Project Access Northwest has served a critically important role in our region's health care system. Because of our work, 60,000+ patients—more than enough to fill every seat in T-Mobile Park—have received access to essential health care. We offer an innovative solution that really works—for patients in need, providers, partners and the greater community. More than 1,700 volunteer providers serve thousands of patients annually. Even so, we need your help to do more.

all at no cost to them. Depending on the care patients need, that initial investment yields big return. With over 50 medical specialties and counting, here are just a few examples of our impressive results:

- Podiatry patients receive an average \$2,372 in care (7X return)
- Gastroenterology patients receive an average \$3,480 in care (10X return)
- Orthopedics patients receive an average \$4,563 in care (14X return)



How Project Access Northwest works for patients

We provide a comprehensive solution for patients who do not qualify for insurance under the Affordable Care Act or they qualify but still cannot afford the out-of-pocket expenses necessary to access life-changing specialty care.

From diagnosis through treatment, discharge and rehabilitation, **patients receive care at no cost**. Services include surgery, anesthesia, labs, imaging, telephonic interpreters as needed and more. We connect the most vulnerable in our community to the care and services they need helping them get healthy and stay that way.

How Project Access Northwest works for providers

With the guidance of our expert care coordination, our patients show up for their appointments on time, with all labs, tests, and imaging as needed.

Our patients have a no-show rate of less than six percent compared to the Medicaid/uninsured average of more than 30 percent! Our providers do not waste time chasing down missing paperwork. They spend their time on what matters most — delivering life-changing care.
